The Bishop has granted me early retirement, because of my recent ill health. From the summer of 2021 I will give up my role as parish priest of St. Joseph's, Newbury. I took up this position on the 9th of September 1998, and those 23 years have been the happiest and the most fulfilling of my priesthood. I sincerely thank you all for that gift and opportunity. I include all those who have touched my life as your parish priest, past and present. You have a prayerfulness, a dedication to the Mass and the Sacraments that is very deep and sincere, you possess a wonderful spirit and a great sense of humour, which I have always appreciated. I have been humbled by your care of me. I would also thank Fr. Peter Codd who stood in for me, with all the parish duties that I could not fulfil due to my absence. But I must thank those, most profusely and sincerely, who have made sure that the parish, and parish life has run smoothly during the Covid 19 pandemic. You stepped up when I was unable to do anything. You have my everlasting gratitude and thanks. I would also like to thank my sister Breda, and her family who rallied and supported me through a difficult time. I am looking forward to a new chapter in my life, and I will grasp the opportunity of retirement with open arms. Finally, I would like to thank all those who are or were involved in the National Health Service. You saved my life and I thank you most sincerely.
