Christopher began his music studies at an early age and won a music Exhibition, followed by a Scholarship, to St Edward's School, Oxford. Thereafter he studied for both Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Music at Durham University. Whilst there he was also able to study with the renowned concert organist, Dame Gillian Weir. Part of his Master's degree was a major project on the organ fugues of J.S. Bach. Since university Christopher has spent several years working as an organist and pianist in various schools, including Marlborough College. During this time, he has had the opportunity to play the organ and accompany school choirs in several of the great English cathedrals including Winchester, St George's Chapel, Windsor and in St Sulpice, Paris. Over the years, Christopher has also given various piano and organ recitals for other charities such as the Army Benevolent Fund, the Charlie Waller Memorial Trust and Help for Heroes, as well as more local charities.
