Disappointingly, MPs voted the Bill through the House of Commons by 314 to 291 at its Third Reading in June. The top priority now is for a seasoned political adviser to operate at Westminster (£20,000) to walk peers through the Bill and alert them to its many pitfalls and dangers. 'Care not Killing' have therefore launched an Appeal because the more that supporters of assisted suicide hear of the troubling consequences new legislation could bring in its wake, the more likely they are to change their minds and reject it in practice.
