#### **NEWS FROM OUR DIOCESES IN ENGLAND AND WALES:**

Pope Francis has appointed **Bishop Philip Moger** as the new **Bishop of Plymouth.** A Leeds priest for over 40 years, Bishop Philip has, until now, served as an Auxiliary Bishop for the Archdiocese of Southwark.

Archbishop Mark O'Toole of Cardiff has announced the creation of the united Archdiocese of Cardiff-Menevia in a pastoral letter following promulgation from Rome, and the decision of Pope Francis.

Opposing Assisted Suicide: Bishop John Sherrington, Lead Bishop for Life Issues for the Bishops' Conference, is encouraging Catholics to unite in prayer and action as Parliament prepares to renew the debate around assisted suicide, and support an assisted suicide bill to be progressed swiftly through the House of Commons possibly before Christmas. Legal, state-sanctioned assisted suicide would be the most profound ethical change in our legislation for decades. Many MPs will not have considered deeply the profound implications of such a change in law which is why it is vital MPs hear from constituents who can graciously articulate the key arguments against it. If assisted suicide is legalised, it will fundamentally alter the ethical fabric of our society and change the doctor/patient relationship, as well as pressurising the vulnerable to end their lives for fear of being a burden.
