Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> October: TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME – YEAR C. All three readings this Sunday speak about Faith and how it works in our lives. "To one who has Faith, no explanation is necessary. To one without Faith, no explanation is possible." (St. Thomas Aquinas). We need to thank God for everything, giving Him the credit for our well-being. Most of us are inclined to forget God's providence when our earthly affairs are going well. We pray to Him only when trouble strikes. God often answers such prayers. Stronger Faith enables us to accept the adversities and the trials of life.

**N.B.** This Sunday is the third of four when, annually, we are obliged to take a 'Mass Count' of attendees as required by the diocese to feed into national statistics which are then submitted to the Vatican.

World Day of Migrants, Refugees, and the Homeless: While usually celebrated on the last Sunday of September, the event this year will be celebrated this weekend, to coincide with the Jubilee of Migrants. The theme is Migrants, missionaries of hope, emphasising the resilience and faith of migrants and refugees in the face of hardship. In Rome, Pope Leo will preside over two days of celebrations. At home, we also mark the event. It is a day for acknowledging the presence of migrants and refugees in our communities, celebrating their contribution and becoming more aware of the difficulties they encounter. This is not a new event - it has been marked in the Catholic Church since 1914 – an indication that the movement of people from their homeland is not a recent phenomenon. Throughout history, people have migrated in search of a better life for themselves and their families.

OCTOBER – Month of the Rosary: October is designated as the "Month of the Rosary" because we celebrate the Feast of 'Our Lady of the Rosary' on 7<sup>th</sup> October. Pope Leo XIV is inviting the faithful to join in praying the Rosary every day during October to invoke God's gift of peace in war-torn lands - "I invite everyone, each day of the coming month, to pray the Rosary for peace—personally, in the family, and in community."

St John's Cathedral Portsmouth: Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> - Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> October: The Cathedral welcomes the National Pilgrim Virgin Statue of Our Lady of Fatima and relics of the Fatima Visionaries, Saints Francisco and Jacinta Marto this weekend. The programme begins at Midday on Saturday when the bishop welcomes and crowns the pilgrim statue of Our Lady of Fatima, and celebrates the lunchtime Mass. The visit continues until after the 12 noon Mass on Sunday 5th October, and includes opportunities for praying the Rosary together, talks and veneration the relics of Saints Francisco and Jacinta Marto, as well as the fifteen minutes of meditation for the First Saturday devotion.
