



Sunday 7th December: SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT,

Year A. The 'stump of Jesse' referenced in today's first reading refers to Jesse, the father of King David, and Jesus is descended from the line of David. He is the branch God promised would grow from Jesse's family tree. John the Baptist in today's Gospel summons us to play our part in the plan of salvation by leading lives of repentance and renewal, thus preparing the way for the Lord's second coming. We start this process by spiritually preparing for the annual celebration of Christmas, the Lord's first coming, as we reform and renew our lives by repentance and works of charity.

Monday 8th December: THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY. Solemnity. 10.00am Mass – The children of St Joseph's School will be present celebrating their End of Term Mass. All are welcome! Pope Pius IX proclaimed the Dogma of the Immaculate Conception on 8th December 1854. In that definition he expressed that Our Lady was conceived free from the stain of the original sin from the moment of her conception. It was a privilege unique to Mary, and a fitting one, for she would one day carry in her womb the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity.

<u>Wednesday 10th December</u>: Open Church 12.30pm – 2pm. The church will be open for quiet prayer and reflection. All are welcome at any time while the church is open.

Friday 12th December: 12 noon - Memorial Service at the Control Tower, Greenham Common, led by Fr Michael. The Service commemorates two tragic accidents, and marks the 81st anniversary of the crash on the Common of a Horsa glider from the 17th Airborne Division on 12th December 1944 which killed two pilots and 31 soldiers. Just 3 days later, on 15th December, two B17 Flying Fortresses returning from a raid on Germany collided in bad weather over Greenham. Of 18 crew, only 2 survived. The memorial to these men, was moved to the control tower site in September 2019. All are welcome to attend.

<u>Saturday 13th December: 10am – 12 noon:</u> First Holy Communion Programme Children's Learning Session at St Joseph's School.

Also, this Saturday - Douai Abbey Pastoral Programme - Advent Reflection Day: 10.30am - 4pm (arrivals and coffee from 10am).
