New Saints: Pope Leo has canonised 7 new Saints. 1) Ignatius Choukrallah Maloyan, an Armenian Archbishop martyred during the Armenian genocide. 2) Peter ToRot – a lay catechist from Papua New Guinea who was killed during World War II. 3) Vincenza Maria Poloni - an Italian religious sister and co-founder of the Sisters of Mercy of Verona. 4) Maria Carmen Elena Rendiles Martinez - a nun from Venezuela who founded the Congregation of the Servants of Jesus. 5) Bartolo Longo - an Italian lawyer

who converted from satanism to become a promoter of the rosary. 6) José Gregorio Hernandez Cisneros - a Venezuelan layman who was recognised as a doctor of the people. 7) Maria Troncatti - an Italian Salesian sister, who spent nearly five decades as a missionary in Ecuador's Amazon rainforest among the indigenous Shuar people.

These saints represent a diverse group of individuals from various backgrounds, including missionaries, martyrs, and lay people - highlighting the Church's commitment to honouring those who have lived out their faith with courage and dedication.
