

Sunday 10th November: <u>REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY</u>. Please note that 11.00am Mass today will commence a few minutes early in order to observe the traditional Act of Remembrance and 2 minute silence at 11.00am together with the rest of the nation. Plan to arrive a little earlier to be seated in time so as not to disrupt this observance. If arriving as it happens, ushers will hold back arrivals at the doors until the Act is concluded. Thank you for your understanding.

'Dilexit Nos': At a time disturbed by much turmoil and anxiety, Pope Francis invites us to fix our gaze on the Sacred Heart of Jesus in a new Encyclical Letter, Dilexit Nos. He quotes his predecessor, Pope John Paul II, "Christ is the heart of the world, and the paschal mystery of his death and resurrection is the centre of history, which because of him, is a history of salvation" (Cf. Dilexit nos No. 31). This is the confidence we regain by drawing ever closer to the Heart of Jesus. This invitation is part of a spiritual thread through Pope Francis' pontificate from the words of his first homily when he reflected: "We can walk as much as we want, we can build many things, but if we do not confess Jesus Christ, things go wrong" (Homily 13 March 2013). In Dilexit nos, the Holy Father offers us a sustained meditation on the Heart of Jesus in the pages of scripture; in the teaching of the Magisterium; and through the history of devotion to the Sacred Heart.

<u>Children's Liturgy of the Word</u>: All children of primary school age welcome, but Child Protection Guidelines prevent those younger than Reception class age taking part. No younger siblings accompanying those at Primary School – please! All catechists are DBS checked to work with children. After a welcome and prayer, the children say sorry prayers and listen to a reading, after which they discuss its relevance to their lives. An activity follows before returning to Mass for the Offertory Procession.

This may pressurise the vulnerable to end their lives for fear of being a burden and destroy patient trust. Catholics must unite in prayer and action now to fight the most profound ethical change in legislation for decades.
