This causes distraction to all – so make a special effort in Lent to arrive in good time before Mass and compose yourself quietly. If unavoidably arriving late, please enter discreetly at the back of the church and take a seat there rather than distracting others by moving towards the front. Also, please note that crossing in front of the sanctuary during Mass is to be avoided if at all possible, and remember always to genuflect before the altar if this movement is unavoidable.

<u>**'CARE – NOT KILLING' PETITION:</u>** Assisted dying may not be available in England and Wales until at least 2029 after MPs approved an extension of the rollout period. An initial two-year "backstop" will now increase to four years after the change was proposed by Kim Leadbeater, the Labour MP behind the Assisted Dying Bill. The fouryear delay, passed by the committee scrutinising the legislation, now means the law is unlikely to be operational until at least 2029 – the year by which the next general election must take place. The threat the Bill poses, however, is still very real.</u>
