TEACHING POINT: The Sign or Kiss of Peace. This part of the Mass is often omitted on Holy Thursday to avoid imitation of Judas, who betrayed Our Lord with a 'kiss' on that day. In medieval times a 'pax brede' was used; a representation of the crucifixion on a flat object with a handle, and this was passed around for everyone to kiss. The kiss of peace was normally given before Communion, to comply with Matthew 5:24, "first make peace with your brother, and then offer your gift at the altar." Today the kiss of peace is more often a handshake, or a bow of acknowledgement.

PAPAL COMMUNICATION: Rome's call for Ethics in AI. CISCO, the multinational digital communications technology company, has signed an agreement at the Vatican committing to an ethical approach to artificial intelligence in the areas of Ethics, Education and Rights. The document aims to promote shared responsibility among international organisations, governments, institutions, and the private sector to create a future in which digital innovation and technological progress and in particular AI - respect the dignity of the human person so that every individual can benefit from the advances of technology. Archbishop Vincenzo Paglia emphasised that artificial intelligence is "no longer a topic just for experts" and that the ethics of its development is more urgent than ever.
