**SUDAN EMERGENCY**: Bishop Paul Swarbrick, the Bishops' Conference's Lead Bishop for Africa, and Bishop Nick Baines, his Church of England counterpart, have issued a joint statement on the conflict in Sudan, saying the war is "a forgotten conflict with no winners". The war has triggered the world's largest hunger crisis, coupled with the worst ongoing displacement crisis worldwide. The World Food Programme report that there are now 10.5 million people, far more people than the entire population of London, displaced, with over 25 million people in need of humanitarian aid. Nearly 15,000 have already been killed, and 26,000 more have been injured, with women and children bearing the brunt of unspeakable violence. A new poll by CAFOD, however, has found that only 5% (one in twenty) of British adults think that Sudan is currently experiencing the world's largest humanitarian crisis. A NEW SAINT: Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati will be canonised in 2025 during the Jubilee Year, the centenary of his death. Frassati, who died aged 24, is beloved by many Catholic young people today for his enthusiastic witness to holiness. A citizen of Turin, he was an avid

mountaineer known for his charitable outreach. At age 17, he joined the St. Vincent de Paul Society and dedicated much of his spare time to taking care of the poor, the homeless, and the sick, as well as demobilized servicemen returning from World War I. He was also involved in the Apostleship of Prayer and Catholic Action. On a photograph of what would be his last climb, Frassati wrote the phrase "Verso L'Alto," which means "to the heights." This phrase has become a motto for Catholics inspired by Frassati to strive for the summit of eternal life with Christ. Frassati died of polio on July 4, 1925. His doctors later speculated that the young man had caught polio while serving the sick.

TEACHING POINT: May, known as "Mary's Month," is when special devotions are encouraged in honour of Our Lady. Why in May? In ancient Greece and Rome, May was dedicated to pagan goddesses connected to fertility and springtime. This led Western culture to view May as a month of life and motherhood. In the 18<sup>th</sup> century, Rome devoted the month of May to Mary, and the practice soon spread throughout the Church. In 1945, Pope Pius XII solidified May as a Marian month when he established the feast of the Queenship of Mary on 31st May. After Vatican II, this feast was moved to 22nd August, but 31st May became instead the feast of the Visitation of Mary. This May, then, let us frequently call on the help of Mary's prayers, especially by attending Mass and by reciting the Rosary.
