TEACHING POINT: The General Instruction on the Roman Missal: "A genuflection, made by bending the right knee to the ground, signifies adoration, and therefore it is reserved for the Most Blessed Sacrament, as well as for the Holy Cross from the solemn adoration during the liturgical celebration on Good Friday until the beginning of the Easter Vigil ... All who pass before the Most Blessed Sacrament genuflect, unless they are moving in procession" (No. 274). When we enter church, we enter God's house. Genuflecting before the tabernacle acknowledges God as our host, and expresses thanks for the invitation that draws us into communion with his Son. **Celebrating Hope** In 'Spes non confundit' Pope Francis writes in his Jubilee document about the gift of the indulgence, 'a way of discovering the unlimited nature of God's mercy. Not by chance, for the ancients, the terms 'mercy' and 'indulgence' were interchangeable, as expressions of the fullness of God's forgiveness, which knows no bounds.' Guidelines on the granting and use of indulgences are available to help the faithful embrace this unique grace, and provide a simple outline on how the faithful can obtain this plenary indulgence, without travelling to Rome or other pilgrimage centres. Assisted Suicide Bill: The Committee scrutinising the Bill has rejected proposals to strengthen the safeguards despite warnings from leading psychiatrists concerned about the "haste" of the legislation which, they argue, could pressurise the vulnerable to end their lives. The Committee rejected amendments to strengthen the Bill and voted down: 1) raising the bar on mental capacity; 2) an amendment to prevent illegal encouragement of someone to seek assisted suicide; 3) an amendment to protect those feeling they are a burden. Bill supporters also spoke against attempts to protect prisoners and the homeless where suicide rates are already high.
