A shepherd leads, nurtures, comforts, corrects, and protects his flock - responsibilities that belong to all Church leaders, parents, civil leaders, and those who are in charge of others.

Seminarian in training for Portsmouth diocese, Nathan King, will speak at Masses today about vocations to the priesthood and the religious life. BILL ON ASSISTED SUICIDE: The Third Reading and vote on the Terminally III Adults (End of Life) Bill is likely to take place on Friday, 16 May, at which time a decision will be made on whether to legalise assisted suicide and make this Bill law. MAY – THE MONTH OF OUR LADY: a specific month when devotions are made in honour of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Over time, many Western cultures came to view May as a month of life and motherhood but it was not until the 18th century that May received a particular association with the Virgin Mary and various private devotions to Mary quickly became widespread in this month. In 1945, Pope Pius XII decreed May as a Marian month when he established the feast of the Queenship of Mary on 31st May. After Vatican II, this feast was moved to 22nd August, but 31st May became instead the feast of the Visitation of Mary.
