PLEASE! – A LITTLE OF YOUR TIME! A Maintenance Committee composed of parishioners drawn from each church community is needed for our new greater Sacred Heart Parish. I desperately need two or three persons from our Parish by the end of December, to sit on the Committee (with a degree of interest in this area) who would be prepared to:

1. Review matters of building repair and maintenance as they arise. 2. Decide which category the matter falls under; urgency; scale of work entailed. 3. Identify appropriate resources available. This would be an ongoing process of gradually gathering a 'bank' of people and reputable firms. 4. If judged appropriate, fellow parishioners could be asked to undertake smaller tasks; the Committee could recommend a local tradesman or firm to the Co-ordinating Pastor or Priest-in-charge, who, in turn, could instruct the Parish Secretary/Administrator to obtain a quote. For larger projects, recommendations and quotes from three reputable firms are required from which one is selected.

Committee members need to meet in person only three or four times a year, but conduct most of their conversation by email/phone/zoom. Do you have talents that you can offer — even for just 6 months, or 1 year? Please speak with Fr Michael.

'Mater Populi Fidelis' ("The Mother of the Faithful People"): A new document of the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith, approved by Pope Leo XIV, offers clarifications on titles applied to the Blessed Virgin Mary, and calls for special attention to the use of the

expression, "Mediatrix of all graces." It reaffirms Catholic doctrine, which has always emphasised that everything in Mary is directed towards the centrality of Christ and His salvific work.
