

<u>OPENING OF THE HOLY YEAR 2025</u>: Pope Francis will open the Jubilee Holy Year 2025 in St. Peter's Basilica on Christmas Eve. Meanwhile, throughout the world, diocesan bishops will inaugurate it in their Cathedrals on Sunday 29th December. Bishop Philip will do this at the 12 noon Mass that day in St John's Cathedral, Portsmouth. All are welcome. The celebration of this Mass constitutes the high point of the Rite of Opening of the Jubilee Year.

BISHOP'S VISIT TO NEWBURY PASTORAL AREA: On 28th November Bishop Philip visited our pastoral area of Newbury and met with Fr Michael and other clergy of our pastoral area churches, along with members of the Evangelisation Strategy Team (EST), to discuss the EST's proposals for the diocesan ten-year mission strategy, 'You Will be My Witnesses', and its implementation. Bishop Philip noted that this part of Berkshire is growing with many new developments, an area with great potential for the Church, for its growth, its life and mission. DIVINE INTERVENTION: The 71st official miracle to have happened in Lourdes, and the first person from England, has been officially declared in the case of John (Jack) Traynor by Archbishop Malcolm McMahon OP, Archbishop of Liverpool. Jack was a pilgrim on the archdiocese's first official pilgrimage to Lourdes in 1923 and was cured dramatically of epilepsy, paralysis of the right arm and paraplegia during the pilgrimage. "Given the weight of medical evidence, the testimony to the faith of Jack Traynor and his devotion to Our Blessed Lady, it is with great joy that I declare that his cure, from multiple serious medical conditions, is to be recognised as a miracle wrought by the power of God through the intercession of Our Lady of Lourdes." said Archbishop available McMahon.
